

Youth 2 Adult Transitions Flow Chart



YP discussed at Panel

All eligible cases to be presented at panel, CM to present part one of the plan. Multi-agency discussion will occur to support transition. If transferring to NPS, transfer will be agreed and Probation Officer (PO) allocated within 1 month. Seconded PO to start transitions module.

By 18

At this stage a YP should have all support in place to make an effective transition to adult services. NPS are to take responsibility for those YP's subject to intervention and a closure asset is to be completed. Case to be closed off and case responsibility with NPS. Cases will be reviewed at panel to discuss progress.



17 and 5 months

Transition plan to be completed

At 17 and 5 months, all eligible cases which will transition to adult support will be identified. If transitioning to National Probation Service (NPS), part one of the transitions plan is to be completed in preparation for the Y2A panel. CM responsible for inviting professional network specific to their YP (SW, substance misuse, CAMHs etc). Retained cases will also be discussed at panel to ensure further support after 18.

Pre-transition meeting

YP, YOS and Probation Officer to meet and complete Stage 2 of the plan, focusing on the next 6 months. Transition to NPS can occur at any point after 17 and 9 months if appropriate support is in place. Retained cases will be reviewed at panel to discuss progress.

Review meeting

At 18 and 1 month the now young adult will have been working with NPS for 4 weeks and will be working through stage 2 of their transition plan. A meeting should be arranged to review their progress, this will be the end point of transition. Retained cases are encouraged to engage for one final check in.
